

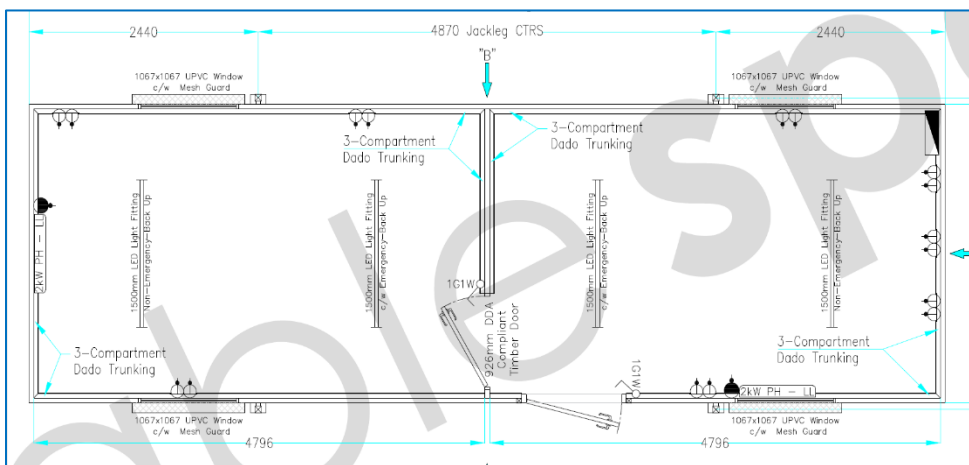


**Hands on learning

The Spring term was absolutely fantastic, and we are so proud of the amazing young people we have had the privilege to engage with. We have worked with over 90 students this spring and delivered 158 teaching sessions. We have issued over 100 AQAs, as the young people continue to develop their engineering and motor skills, as well as the softer skills such as teamworking and communication which are all so vital for their future engagement with colleges, employers and their communities.

GASP continues to be very grateful to our funders, supporters and partner organisations who enable us to continue our vital work with Surrey's challenged youth.
