

# GASP Motor Project December 2024



It has been a fantastic start to the new academic year, with more than 250 students referred to GASP from over 40 organisations. These include mainstream schools, SEND provision, Surrey County Council and Alternative Provision. In just 14 weeks, we have already awarded over 200 AQA unit awards!

The GASP team continue to extend and diversify our teaching sessions, further incorporating core STEM learning and elements of the GCSE curriculum. All activities remain 'hands on', and demonstrate the practical application of maths and physics. This term students have additionally engaged with: Energy - the transfer of energy within an engine (closed system); thermal conductivity and the use of lubricants: Electricity - diagrams and symbols; Series and parallel circuits with a vehicle: Magnetism - electric motors: Forces - acceleration and deceleration; gearing systems and brakes; and stopping distances.

We continue to enhance our courses by facilitating workplace experiences, offering diverse employer engagements for GASP students. This term, students have visited Ringway, Brooklands Museum (Heritage Academy) and Stanhope Seta. Engagements have varied from one-off visits, to term-long, employer-led projects.

Our annual Trustee strategic away day took place in November, and we are extremely grateful to Unum who kindly donated a meeting room for the event. We were delighted to welcome Learning Partners CEO, Jack Mayhew who spoke to the Trustees about the role of GASP within his schools, complimenting and thanking our incredible tutors for the work they do. Jack provided an insight into education within Surrey, and identified challenges which GASP may be able to help schools overcome. Jack's key message was the importance of effective partnership working, to ensure GASP continues to evolve to meet the need of Surrey's young people.



During the summer break, GASP partnered with Big Leaf Foundation to work with displaced young people. Kindly funded by the Schutz Engel Trust, in memory of Andy Stallman, the week-long course enabled six talented young men to engage with practical engineering skills, whilst also improving their English.

We recently visited the Heritage Academy at Brooklands Museum with a group of students to learn more about vehicle restoration.

Following a tour of the museum, the children were shown around the workshop. Here they were presented with various types of welders, ramps and a variety of classic vehicles.

After a health and safety briefing the students were introduced to bodywork and repairs. After denting car panels, the children used a dolly and hammer to remove them. The panels were then polished and finished to look like new!

We were delighted to have two site visits to Ringway's depot in Guildford this term. Students from the Inclusive Education Trust were given a unique insight to Highways Maintenance which included an introduction to Ringway's huge fleet of vehicles. They gained an understanding of each vehicles individual uses and work schedules, as well as learning about the composition of the 'grit' which is spread on icy roads.

They were shown around the control room, and spoke to the Ringway team about their education and careers, and the opportunities Ringway presented for personal and professional growth and development.







GASP has been working with Stanhope-Seta, a family-run precision engineering company, for many years. The team at Stanhope offer GASP students a unique opportunity to experience real engineering principles and to design and complete practical challenges. This term students from Chertsey High School attended and learnt about the principles of flight, aerodynamics and the laws of physics.

Over a period of four weeks, working with the Stanhope team, the children designed their own rockets using CAD. They then printed their designs on a 3D printer to create working models. Using compressed air, the rockets were then flown and each was assessed for speed, velocity, stability and durability.
